In the true entrepreneurial spirit, when an idea doesn't work well, you make changes and so, Canadian Bridge Supplies has been reintroduced on the internet as a much more free standing enterprise.

www.canadianbridgesupplies.com and you will find a cornucopia of all things bridge. The site is quite clearly still in its early stages of development, but even now you can see a very effective site for all bridge players. Whether it is cards, boards, convention card sheets, card holders, knick knacks or books, CBS has them, usually in stock. What is new and very different is that the site is built around a very efficient shopping cart program. You can wander the various aisles and pick up a book and a set of table markers (or most anything else) and put them in your shopping cart. When you are ready to purchase, you simply go to the checkout area, make sure what you want is in the shopping cart and pay with Visa, Master Card or PayPal. Then your items are shipped to your door.

The owners clearly hope that their site will become a gathering point for bridge players and they welcome the posting of

any upcoming events. Of course, all the sectionals and regionals are well posted on the ACBL site, but there are thousands of things that never make it to the attention of the ACBL. The black tie affair last September comes to mind as does the big fund raiser that the Calgary Community Bridge League is running in mid-October featuring Mike Lawrence. The site looks like an ideal place to promote the rubber bridge tournaments that are so prevalent almost every weekend in small town central Alberta.

What with Larry Chow and Lynda Cole of Pacific Bridge Supplies casting their eyes towards retirement and with nobody appearing on the horizon to buy and run that operation, CBS might have a future brighter than even the owners' perceive. If you have read all your bridge books until the pages are torn and dog-eared, this new and growing website may well provide you with the fix to satisfy your addiction. Congratulations folks. It looks to me like you have a winner!
